

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

On or about April 28, 2023, the Town of Kirklin intends to apply to the Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs for a grant from the State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Wastewater/Drinking Water Program. This program is funded by Title I of the federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. These funds are to be used for a community development project that will include the following activities: Improvements to the Town's wastewater treatment and collection system. The total amount of CDBG funds to be requested is \$700,000.00. The amount of CDBG funds proposed to be used for activities that will benefit low- and moderate-income persons is \$385,420.00. The Town also proposes to expend an estimated \$4,684,000.00 in non-CDBG funds on the project. These non-CDBG funds will be derived from the following sources: Finance Authority (IFA)/State Revolving Fund (SRF) Loan Program.

The Town of Kirklin will hold a public hearing on April 10, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Hall located at 113 N. Main Street, Kirklin Indiana 46050. The purpose of the public hearing is to provide interested parties an opportunity to express their views on the proposed federally funded CDBG project. Persons with disabilities or non-English speaking persons who wish to attend the public hearing and need assistance should contact Mary King, Clerk Treasurer at (765) 279-8786 no later than April 7, 2023. Every effort will be made to make reasonable accommodations for these persons.

Information related to this project will be available for review prior to the public hearing as of April 10, 2023, at the office of the clerk treasurer located at 113 N Main Street, Kirklin, Indiana 46050 between the hours of 10:00 am – 3:30 pm. Interested citizens are invited to provide comments regarding these issues either at the public hearing or by prior written statement. Written comments should be submitted to: Town of Kirklin, P.O. Box 147, Kirklin, Indiana 46050 no later than April 7, 2023, to ensure placement of such comments in the official record of the public hearing proceedings. A plan to minimize displacement and provide assistance to those displaced has been prepared by the Town of Kirklin and is also available to the public. This project will result in no displacement of any persons or businesses.
